Our Lodge continues its commitment to The Maryland Living Center thanks to your generous contributions to Youth Activities and E.N.F. The Center really relies on our donations of kitchen items for incoming youths who need a safe place to live while finishing high school. The staff there teach them responsibility, life lessons they will need to leave the facility as productive and confident young adults.

The kids are always so surprised when we bring in huge stacks of most everything they will need to set up kitchens. We supply dishes, silverware, pots and pans, a full range of

utensils and baking needs, toasters and mixers. We also started contributing cleaning supplies, because those items are expensive as well.

Our first cooking that we had planned for the kids was canceled because the both staff and the kids had the stomach flu. So, the first class was held on Thursday March 12th. Most of the time there is an open apartment we can use to gather the kids into and hold a class. They did not have an open room, so the House manager Steve kindly offered his apartment for the class. Angie Pedroza planned, shopped for and did all of the prep work for two great meals. We are never sure how many kids will be attending because of classes or work schedules, and this class was kind of small. We started with 3, and one other joined us when he returned from work. Nevertheless, the 3 young men who came really engaged and were eager to learn.

There was a large round table, and plenty of room for Angie and the 3 boys to have a real hand on lesson. She 1st taught them how to skin and de-bone a whole cooked chicken and turn that into a chicken casserole and chicken salad. We all ate together both the casserole and chicken salad sandwiches, and they had enough to take some back to their apartment. After the class was finished they picked from the stacks of kitchen items that they were lacking in. Brandi printed up 4 easy chicken recipes for the kids to take and give to the residents that couldn't come.

Due to Covid-19 Pandemic, we are regrettably unable to hold anymore classes, because the Center is under semi-lock down (no visitors) for the protection of the residents and staff. Thank you Angie and Brandi for your skills to interact and teach the kids and your genuine enthusiasm!


Does Corner By: Pat DuBois
