

As I contemplated what to write this month, I thought to myself there is a few days in the month of June that are significant to me (June 9) but probably not for anyone else at the Elks so that left Flag Day (June 14) and Father's Day (June 21st) .so here I go.

Flag Day-What is it, why do we celebrate it? I have to be honest with you before becoming an Elk, I didn't think much about it. I knew it was a day that people put out their flag but that was about it. I soon learned it was much more.

Flag Day History:

In 1775 during the American Revolution the colonist were not fighting under one single flag but instead each had their own flag. In June of 1775, the 2nd Continental Congress met and created the Continental Army. This led to the creation of what was our first flag, which was 13 red and white alternating stripes and a Union Jack in the corner. Many believed this flag resembled the British flag and were unhappy about it so on June 14, 1777 the 2nd Continental Congress passed a resolution stating that the flag of the United States be 13 stripes, alternate red and white and that the union be 13 white stars in a blue field. In 1916 President Woodrow Wilson marked the anniversary of that decree by officially establishing June 14 as Flag Day.

Why does the Elks Organization celebrate Flag Day? The Benevolent and Protective Order of the Elks has celebrated the holiday since the early days of the organization and allegiance to the flag is a requirement of every member. In 1907, the BPOE Grand Lodge designated by resolution June 14 as Flag Day. The Grand Lodge of the Order adopted mandatory observance of the occasion by everyone in 1911, and that requirement continues.

So, this brings me to our local Elks Lodge, the Elks Lodge will be observing Flag Day this year by performing our Flag Day Ritual Service on Sunday, June 14 at 4:00 PM at the Lodge. This Ritual Service is very moving and educational This event is open to the public but keep in mind that we will still need to maintain social distancing and we are planning to have this service outside so please plan accordingly with lawn chairs, etc.

Now on to Father's Day (June 21) Did you know that the Elks have a ritual for Father's Day? It is not mandatory but there is a ritual so I would like to share an excerpt from that ritual. As I read it I could help but remember my father whom I loss 5 years ago. My dad was a hardworking, simple man who was a role model for many young boys as their baseball coach. He was a man of little words but when he spoke it was lasting words of wisdom.

"Observance of Father's Day"

My brothers/sisters and friends we celebrate the observance of Father's Day and pay tribute to Father. To the Fathers whose guidance and wisdom still resonate with us on a daily basis; to those Fathers who are still to become a mentor to their children and to those Fathers whose guidance and wisdom are but a fond memory in our hearts and minds.

The third Sunday of June is reserved for the observance of Father's Day and what a fitting time of the year for this recognition. For a father's love and inspiration for his children is a bright and endearing as the longest days of the year. Similar to the inspiration of our Order-the mighty Elk-Fathers provide a guiding presence that inspires us as children and adults to become true and faithful to ourselves and all those around us. Their strength and convictions are the cornerstones which teach us to be steadfast and fair. Their benevolence and gentleness show us to be charitable and kind to all.

Remembrance of Father is more than pictures on memory's wall; it is more than a poem or a few memories. Who are the hero's of life? Are they the great leaders of nations, the generals, poets, or geniuses? Or are they the men who helped mold them, guide them, and teach them throughout their lives?
