Our Lodge supports Maryland Living Center with the Beacon Grant by providing all the essentials needed to set up a kitchen for incoming residents. The residents are at risk kids who have aged out of the foster system. Their ages range from 15 to 19. The CASA run facility gives them a small apartment to stay in, and the supervision and education to become productive adults. In addition to purchasing the kitchen products, we teach them to cook simple meals, and give them the confidence to cook for themselves. Some of the kids love to cook and are anxious to learn something new. They often have tips and recipes to share with us as well. Others are happy to learn simple things like making grilled cheese or tips on how to pee an egg.



This year Angie Pedroza has volunteered her talents to teach the classes, and Brandi Archer has been a big help with shopping and helping the kids during the class. We brought a nice variety of kitchen items to our first class for the kids to pick from. I had brought pots and pans, dishes, storage containers, baking needs earlier to pick from. I am always impressed that they are careful to take only what they need and are so surprised and grateful to have such a nice variety of items.

Angie taught the kids to make their own personal lasagnas in loaf pans to take back to their rooms. She and her mom Donna Patten also made a large lasagna at home so that everyone got a piece to try. We also brought French bread to have with it.

Angie did a fantastic job! She made a real connection with the kids and everyone really wanted to learn for themselves. She made sure that everyone took part in the process and addressed all the different skill sets. Some needed to learn to be comfortable frying hamburger or chopping onions. Everyone has different tastes, and so we taught how to adjust recipes to their tastes as well. They were all very thankful and were excited we were coming back again.

Brandi was great helping the kids at the different stations and took pictures during the class. The Director Jennifer, and some of the staff were there to watch, (and make a lasagna to go!). She was so impressed with how the class went! They all had fun with the residents and there were a lot of laughs. There were nine residents and four staff members there, so the room was full! We were lucky a large apartment was open, so the house manager Steve had everything we needed, all set up and ready to go for us.

The next class will be on Monday March 4th. By special request, the residents we will be learning how to make enchiladas, and breakfast casseroles!
